1. Dr. Radovan Karadzic respectfully requests that the Trial Chamber allow General Ratko Mladic's counsel to be present during his testimony scheduled for 28 January 2014.

2. In its *Decision on Accused's Motion to Subpoena Ratko Mladic* (11 December 2013), the Trial Chamber indicated that it will ensure that General Mladic's rights are safeguarded, in light of his pending case.¹


3. In order to assist the Chamber in safeguarding General Mladic's rights, Dr. Karadzic will limit his questions to General Mladic to only those essential to his case. He hereby provides advance notice of the questions he intends to put to Colonel Mladic in his direct examination.

4. Those questions are:

- (1) What positions have you held during your military career?
- (2) Did you ever inform me, either orally or in writing, that prisoners from Srebrenica would be, were being, or had been executed?
- (3) Did we have any agreement or understanding that the citizens of Sarajevo should be subjected to terror by shelling and sniping?
- (4) What were the reasons for the shelling and sniping in Sarajevo?
- (5) Is that what you informed me?
- (6) Did we have any agreement or understanding to expel Muslims and Croats residing in Serb-controlled areas?
